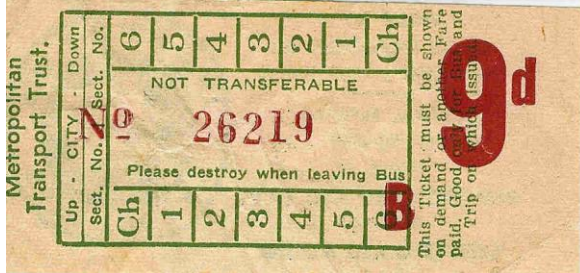

The MTT was constituted in 1955 and continues to run bus services in Tasmania. The last tram ran in 1960 and the last trolleybus in 1968 but for convenience the whole of the MTT (except those mentioning bus only) is listed in the tram section.

Black/colour: 2d child pink, 4d orange, 5d pink, 6d light blue, 8d off white, 9d orange, 11d yellow



3d adult light blue LINDISFARNE SERVICE replaces ROAD TRANSPORT BRANCH



5d black/lilac pink



Black/purple flimsy

Tamar Services P/L, Beaconsfield.

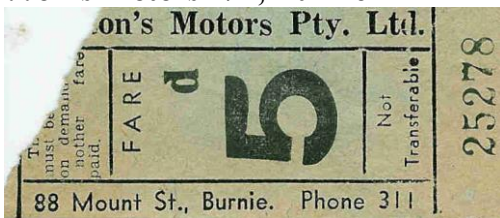


6/6 red with black conditions message on back.

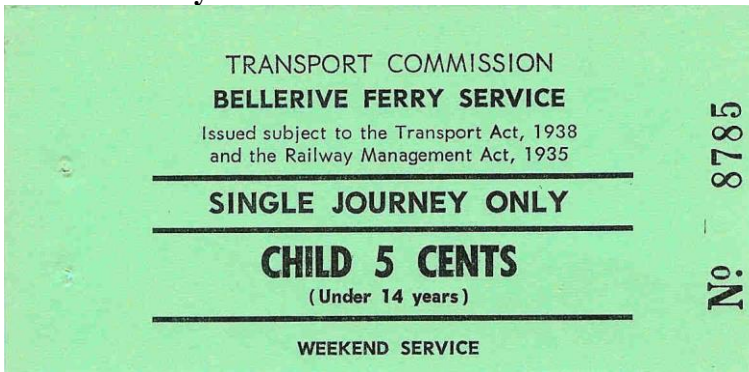

Also revisions in Ingles, Presgrave & Craig *The Railway Stamps of Mainland Australia*. Also reported in *Cinderellas Australasia* 4. Tasmanian Parcels Express Co (Adelaide) in CA 6. This may have had something to do with the carriage of mail to Tattersalls.

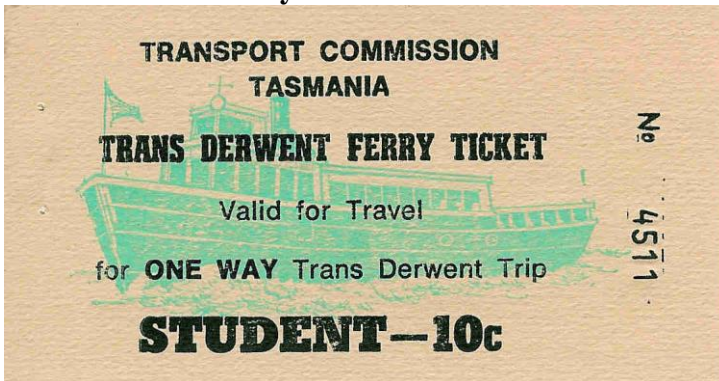
